Tables

Most often researchers place figures and tables in Chapter 4 to add visual effects to augment the narrative of data analysis details. Tables can be placed in any appropriate place needed for further illumination of a discussion. Tables and/or figures can be used in other chapters as well. "Design tables and figures with readers in mind. Communicate findings clearly while also creating attractive visual displays" (APA, 2020, p 196). Tables exceeding one page in length need the heading rows repeated on the next page or be moved to an appendix.

The following are two Table examples. Table 1 is an example you will want to create for your own study and is required for the final review in Tk20.

Note: The table identifier (Table #) is placed above the title in bold font and the title is placed in italics.


