

# Forever a Phoenix® Doctoral Scholarship October 2023

Section	Description
Summary	<p>All UOPX Alumni students who i) apply for and enroll in a University of Phoenix doctoral degree program and (ii) apply for this Forever a Phoenix® Doctoral Scholarship – October 2023 (“Scholarship”) prior to the deadline and register and post attendance in their first class between October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 and October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023 (“Initial Attendance Window”) will receive a scholarship up to \$3,000 each.</p> <p>NOTE: Students must begin the admissions application prior to completing this scholarship application.</p>

<p>Selection Process</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The recipients of the scholarships will be selected by the University of Phoenix.</li> <li>2. It is the applicant's responsibility to submit a complete and signed application along with any required and supporting documentation, which must be received on or before the Application Deadline. The University of Phoenix accepts no responsibility for incomplete applications, applications not in proper form, lost applications, or any other submission in exception to the instructions.</li> <li>3. Scholarship selection shall be made without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, national origin, disability, veteran status, or any other category protected by federal, state, or local law.</li> <li>4. The decision of the University of Phoenix is final and not subject to review.</li> <li>5. Starting on November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, the University of Phoenix will begin the selection process for eligible qualified students.</li> <li>6. Recipients will be notified no later than December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.</li> </ol>
<p>Scholarship Award Distribution and Timing</p>	<p>The University of Phoenix will determine and notify the recipients of the scholarships upon validation.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The maximum scholarship award is \$3,000. The Scholarship shall be disbursed as a credit toward the student's tuition payments at a rate of \$375 per course beginning with the student's first attended course and thereafter for up to eight courses for those continuously attended courses in their doctoral program until: (i) the student has maximized the \$3,000 Scholarship amount, or (ii) two years has elapsed from the student's first date of attendance in the their first course, or (iii) the student graduates from their program, whichever comes first. Subsections (i)-(iii) are collectively hereinafter referred to as "Terminating Events".</li> <li>2. Only the applicants selected as Scholarship recipients will be notified by the University of Phoenix.</li> </ol>
<p>Maintenance Requirements</p>	<p>In order to continue disbursement of the scholarship award, applicant must meet the following maintenance requirements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Applicant must remain in a doctoral program (all coursework attended must be program applicable courses). Awards will only be applied to courses taken as part of their doctoral program, specific to the original program level award.</li> </ol>

2. Applicant must successfully pass each course attempted in accordance with their program's requirements as outlined in the academic catalog for all courses. Any withdrawals or courses not successfully passed in accordance with the program requirements will terminate the scholarship.
3. Applicant must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.25 or better for all courses.

  - c. Applicants pursuing stand-alone University of Phoenix certificates.
  - d. Applicants pursuing a Competency Based Education program.
  - e. Current University of Phoenix Students
  - f. Students who previously started a doctoral program with the University of Phoenix
  - g. Applicants receiving any employer benefits or discounts
  - h. Applicants receiving Military Tuition Rate
  - i. Students receiving an international student discount
  - j. Applicants who do not meet the University of Phoenix eligibility requirements
  - k. Students who enroll and start their first course outside the scholarship window.
  - l. Applicants who have received another University of Phoenix scholarship award in the past two years
6. The Scholarship will automatically terminate if:
  - a. Applicant fails to meet the eligibility requirements
  - b. Recipient is Academically Disqualified, Disqualified for Admission, Scholastically Disqualified, Scholastically Suspended or Expelled as outlined in the University Catalog.
  - c. Recipient is out of attendance on an unapproved leave of absence for more than 35 days.
  - d. Recipient completes their doctoral degree program.
  - e. Receives the maximum scholarship award
